Chapter News

Italian Chapter

On July 3, 2002, Dr. Luigi Tesio, chair of the Italian chapter of the IOM, sponsored a half-day lecture at the Maurgeri Foundation in Pavia, Italy. The theme was "Rasch analysis: the same metre from human sciences to medicine."

The conference was opened by Dr. Giorgio Vittadini, professor of statistics at the University of Milan-Bicocca. Dr. Vittadini is the Director of the Center for Research on Services to the Persons (CRISP). Dr. David Andrich from Murdoch University, Perth, Western Australia served as the main invited speaker and spoke on "Fundamental measurement: principles and practice of Rasch analysis." Dr. Tesio, who

heads a 50-bed inpatient rehabilitation unit at the Salvatore Maurgeri Foundation, was the third and last speaker. He addressed the very practical uses of the model in rehabilitation medicine.

Some 150 persons attended, coming from all parts of Italy. About half of them had a mathematical-statistical background, while the remainder comprised physicians, physical therapists, and psychologists. Rasch modeling has not been *unknown* in Italy: but the participants who attended believed that, after this Conference, the gaps between different users became smaller, and that new potential users arose.

Institute for Objective Measurement Workshop (IOMW)

The eleventh IOMW took place in New Orleans, Louisiana USA on April 6-7, 2002. Sixty-nine persons took part. In addition to the United States, six other countries were represented. These included Australia, Canada, Egypt, Germany, Spain, and the United Kingdom.

Many individuals presented papers during the two-day meeting. During the first day's lunch session, the leaders of IOMW invited discussion by the various persons who were present. They asked participants to describe their particular contribution to the field of Rasch measurement. Those responding described, among other contributions, such things as educational programs and publications. Accordingly, Drs. William Fisher, Jr. and Mary Lunz, two of IOM's Board

of Directors, offered information to the group about the purpose of the IOM. They stressed that the IOM was organized to provide an umbrella over the various aspects the others presented. Drs. Fisher and Lunz invited all persons present to participate in the IOM.

On the evening of the first day, meeting planners invited everyone to an authentic Cajun dinner at Mulate's restaurant in downtown New Orleans. Everyone who attended had a wonderful time.

Midwestern Objective Measurement Seminar (MOMS)

As those living in the state of Illinois will recall, Dr. Benjamin Wright, co-founder of the IOM, served as host for the MOMS meetings at the University of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois USA for many years. Since Dr. Wright is still recovering from a serious illness, Dr. Everett Smith of the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC), Chicago, Illinois USA undertook the endeavor in conjunction with the IOM.

Dr. Smith convened the first "UIC" meeting of MOMS on Friday, May 10, 2002 at UIC, Chicago, Illinois USA. It was jointly sponsored by UIC and the IOM. Approximately 30 Rasch researchers and practitioners attended and twelve of those made presentations.

Dr. Smith plans to continue hosting the meetings on a semi-annual basis. The next MOMS has tentatively been scheduled for December 13, 2002 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Fourth All-Russia Workshop

The fourth All-Russia workshop on Educational Innovations and Technologies Efficiency estimation was held on June 21 – 22, 2002 at the Slaviansk Branch of the Armavir State Pedagogical Institute (SB ASPI), Krasnodar Territory, The Russian Federation.

Thirty presentations were organized into four tracks:

- Traditional testing and Rasch measurement
- Design and analysis of pedagogical experiments
- Educational process monitoring
- Information technologies in educational processes

The next fifth All-Russia workshop on Educational Innovations and Technologies Efficiency Estimation will be held on June 26 - 27, 2003 at the Slaviansk Branch of the Armavir State Pedagogical Institute (SB ASPI), Krasnodar Territory, The Russian Federation. The tracks will be the same.

The participants of the workshop have elected to form the Slavian Chapter of the IOM.
